

## Daughters Of God's Kingdom

Read Together I Samuel 1:1-5

**Discussion Question 1:** What do we discover about Hannah's life so far?

Read together 1 Samuel 1:6-8

**Discussion Question 2:** What do we learn about Hannah's marriage, and how she is treated by Peninnah (Elkanah's other wife)? How is this marriage different from God's original design in the garden with Adam and Eve?

Read 1 Samuel 1:9-11

**Discussion Question 3:** Where did Hannah take her problems to, and how did she respond to her pain and bitterness? How can we use this example in our own life when we are facing trials?

**Discussion Question 4:** What does verse 11 tell us about God's timing in regards to preparing our own heart?

Read together 1 Samuel 1:12-18

**Discussion Question 5:** What does Eli, the priest first think about Hannah when he sees her praying in the tabernacle?

**Discussion Question 6:** How does Hannah respond to Eli in verse 15-16? How does she describe her prayer before the Lord?

**Discussion Question 7:** What does Eli tell Hannah to do in verse 17?

**Discussion Question 8:** What does verse 18 tell us Hannah does after her prayer? Do you think Hannah had faith to believe in her request before the Lord after she gave her burden of grief to him?

Mark 11:24 "Therefore I say to you, whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you receive them, and you will have them."

In closing, Do we display this faith after we take our cares and concerns before the Lord? Do we trust in him enough to get up and not dwell in the problem, but put our hope in Christ and know he has got this as Hannah displayed in verse 18?
